The following resolution was offered by Paul Slowey, seconded by Thomas Gallagher, to wit:

**Resolution No. 2008-05-12-02**

**RESOLUTION FINALIZING THE PRELIMINARY INDUCEMENT RESOLUTION FOR A CERTAIN COMMERCIAL PROJECT FOR JOHN D. SCANLON OR A BUSINESS ENTITY TO BE FORMED AND WHOLLY OWNED BY MR. SCANLON (COLLECTIVELY, THE "COMPANY").**

WHEREAS, Cortland County Industrial Development Agency (the "Agency") is authorized and empowered by the provisions of Chapter 1030 of the 1969 Laws of New York, constituting Title 1 of Article 18-A of the General Municipal Law, Chapter 24 of the Consolidated Laws of New York, as amended (the "Enabling Act") and Chapter 77 of the 1974 Laws of New York, as amended, constituting Section 902 of said General Municipal Law (said Chapter and the Enabling Act being hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Act") to promote, develop, encourage and assist in the acquiring, constructing, reconstructing, improving, maintaining, equipping and furnishing of manufacturing facilities, among others, for the purpose of promoting, attracting and developing economically sound commerce and industry to advance the job opportunities, health, general prosperity and economic welfare of the people of the State of New York, to improve their prosperity and standard of living, and to prevent unemployment and economic deterioration; and

WHEREAS, to accomplish its stated purposes, the Agency is authorized and empowered under the Act to acquire, construct, reconstruct and install one or more "projects" (as defined in the Act) or to cause said projects to be acquired, constructed, reconstructed and installed, and to convey said projects or to lease said projects with the obligation to purchase; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to an application, including a cost benefit analysis (the "Application") submitted to the Agency by John D. Scanlon or a business entity to be formed and wholly owned by Mr. Scanlon (collectively, the "Company"), the members of the Agency, on March 17, 2008, adopted a resolution (the "Preliminary Inducement Resolution") whereby the Agency preliminarily agreed, subject to numerous conditions, to consider undertaking a project (the "Project") consisting of the following: (A)(1) the acquisition of an interest in an approximately 0.4 acre parcel of land (the "Land") located at the corner of Main Street and Tompkins Street in the City of Cortland, Cortland County, New York; (2) the construction on the Land of a building to contain approximately 21,000 square feet of space (the "Facility") and (3) the acquisition and installation therein and thereon of certain materials, furnishings, machinery and equipment (the "Equipment"), all of the foregoing to constitute a mixed use building containing retail space and residential space to be operated by the Company (the Land, the Facility and the Equipment being collectively referred to as the "Project Facility"); (B) the granting of certain "financial assistance" (within the meaning of Section 854(14) of the Act) with respect to the foregoing, including potential exemptions from certain sales taxes, real estate transfer taxes, mortgage recording taxes and real property taxes (collectively, the "Financial Assistance"); and (C) the lease (with an obligation to purchase) or sale of the Project Facility to the Company or such other person as may be designated by the Company and agreed upon by the Agency; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Preliminary Inducement Resolution adopted by the members of the Agency on March 17, 2008, the Executive Director of the Agency (A) caused notice of a public hearing of the Agency to hear all persons interested in the Project and the financial assistance being contemplated by the Agency with respect to the Project (the "Public Hearing") to be mailed on April 4, 2008 to the chief executive

officer of the county and of each city, town, village and school district in which the Project is to be located, (B) caused notice of the Public Hearing to be published on April 7, 2008 in the Cortland Standard, a newspaper of general circulation available to residents of the County of Cortland, (C) conducted the Public Hearing on May 12, 2008 at 12:00 o'clock p.m., local time at the office of the Agency located at 37 Church Street, in the City of Cortland, Cortland County, New York, (D) prepared a report of the Public Hearing which fairly summarized the views presented at said public hearing and distributed same to the members of the Agency; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law, Chapter 43-B of the Consolidated Laws of New York, as amended (the "SEQR Act"), and the regulations (the "Regulations") adopted pursuant thereto by the Department of Environmental Conservation of the State of New York (collectively with the SEQR Act, "SEQRA"), the members of the Agency adopted a resolution on April 14, 2008 (the "SEQR Resolution") in which the Agency determined to be bound by the findings of the City of Cortland Planning Commission under SEQRA in relation to the Project; and

WHEREAS, in compliance with the provisions of Section 859-a of the Act, the Preliminary Inducement Resolution indicated that the undertakings of the Agency contained therein are contingent upon the Agency making a determination to proceed with the Project following compliance by the Agency with the public notice and public hearing requirements set forth in Section 859-a of the Act; and

WHEREAS, having complied with the requirements of Section 859-a of the Act and the requirements of SEQRA with respect to the Project, the Agency now desires to make its final determination whether to proceed with the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF CORTLAND COUNTY INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Agency hereby determines that the Agency has now fully complied with the requirements of Section 859-a of the Act and the requirements of SEQRA that relate to the Project.

Section 2. Having reviewed the Report, and having considered fully all comments contained therein, the Agency hereby further determines to proceed with the Project and the granting of the Financial Assistance described in the notice of the Public Hearing.

Section 3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.
